Student 'A'

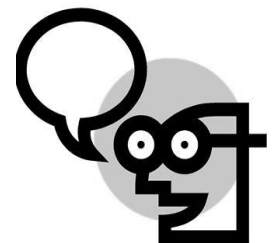
- *Discuss the questions below with your partner.*
