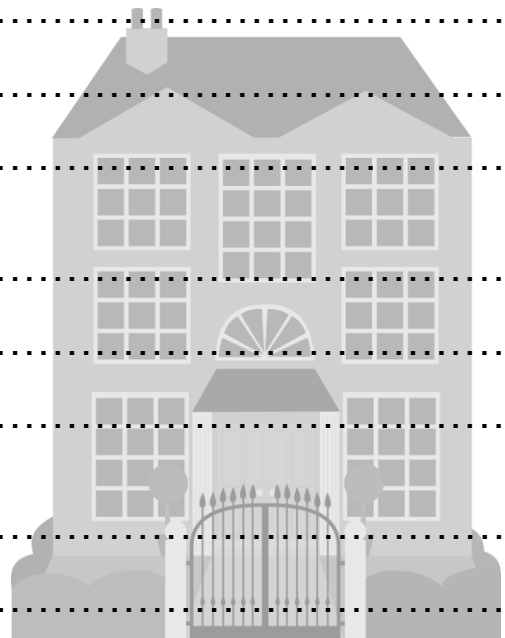

NOTES & ANSWER KEYS

Part 1 / Getting Ready (5-10 mins)

Part 2 / Vocabulary (10 mins)
